- TIP # 1: **Know It**
- Any Bachelor Degree at Jacksonville University requires:
 - Core Curriculum Courses,
 - POD (Pathways of Distinction) Courses,
 - Elective Courses.
- Minimum credits to graduate: 120.0 credit hours.
- Credit hours per semester:
 - 15.0 16.0 credit hours per semester
 - 12.0 credit hours is full-time
 - 18.0 credit hour maximum



- Special advising programs for students experiencing academic difficulty
- · Mid-semester progress reports
