Cristian Dirkhising (Dur-kai-zing) is a concert pianist and composer living in Florida, studying music composition and piano performance at Jacksonville University under Dr. Scott Watkins for piano and Dr. Jianjun He for composition respectively. Being born in the rural Midwest where a musical career is unthinkable to most in the area, he has proven that music's power can be harnessed by anybody despite their regional and socioeconomic origins. Some of Dirkhising's accomplishments and activities include but are not limited to winning two competitions from the prestigious piano program at Douglas Anderson School of the Arts, performing a multitude of new and exciting works to the public at some of Jacksonville's public venues such as the Downtown Public Library, performing in masterclasses open and inclusive to the public with prestigious artists in Jacoby Hall including guest pianist Zhang Zuo, being nationally recognized and awarded to be Duval County's best composer by the national PTA Reflections competition, winning the 2020 Concerto Competition at Jacksonville University, winning runner-up in the Charleston International 2021 Spring Music Competition. Results, and winning first prize in the Charleston International 2021 Autumn Music Competition.



Michael Stabile is a composer and oboist. As a student at Jacksonville University, he was the recipient of the Delius Award for excellence in composition for the 2019- 2020 school year. He has received other awards for excellence in theory and composition while attending the university. Mr. Stabile studied music composition under Dr. Jianjun He. He also studied oboe performance under Eric Olson, principal oboist of the Jacksonville Symphony Orchestra for more than 30 years. Under the tutelage of these talented musicians, Michael has vastly grown his musical skills. Michael Stabile received his Bachelor of Music Composition degree from Jacksonville University in 2021.



Nicholas Franklin Moseley is an accomplished composer, arranger, and pianist based in Jacksonville, Florida. In his remarkable musical career, Nicholas has allowed two questions to guide his creative process when composing music: "What if?" and, "Why not?" This is prominently seen in their experimental electronic piece *A 2020 Rhapsody* "When Is This Gonna End?" (2020), the 88 Minimalist Pieces for Piano Vol I and Vol II (2021), and the unapologetic I Woke Up and Chose Violence song cycle (2019). Nicholas's music is artfully woven by cinematic and dramatic elements This journey of emotions captured by his music is akin to the intense feelings brought by Mozart, Danny Elfman, Freddie Mercury, and John Williams.

In 2016, while at Polk State College, a community college in central Florida, Nicholas founded a band, The Pips. The Pips played for the student vocal groups Sorority of Sound, Burgundy, and Mélange, of which they wrote vocal arrangements for. In 2017 and 2018, Nicholas won the Phi Theta Kappa In ternational Honors Society: Florida Region Music Composition Award. He was later granted the opportunity to compose music for the prestigious honor society.

After graduating from Polk State College, Nicholas continued his music education at Jacksonville University under the teachings of Dr Jianjun He. In their lessons with Dr He, Nicholas learned to not be so rigid with his writing, to loosen up, and really hone the craft of music composition. In their Senior Year, he received an Excellence in Music Theory award, the Delius Composition Award and graduated Summa Cum Laude from Jacksonville University. Nicholas now works at Jacksonville University as the Office Assistant to the chair of Music, Professor Kimberly Beasley, the chair of Theater, Professor Erik DeCicco, and manages Terry Concert Hall.

In their spare time, Nicholas enjoys playing video/board games with friends, cooking, baking, photography, reading, writing stories, crocheting, modelling, and acting in murder mystery dinner theatre.
